ENFORCEMENT HIGHLIGHTS:

- Officers were assigned to work the 2016 US Nationals from August 31st to September 5th. All golf carts and the Mobile Command Bus were deployed for the event. This was the highest attendance recorded in years due to pleasant weather conditions and lower temperatures. There were no major incidents to report and the crowd was very courteous and well-mannered for this year's event.
- Brownsburg Police assisted a homeless man named Vincent to his destination in Champagne, IL. Vincent was given a voucher to stay in a local hotel for the night and was transported the next morning. He had so many belongings that the trip had to be made in a pick up to accommodate his property. He was very pleased as you can tell from the picture.

Activity

9/6

Hendricks Reginal Hospital construction site trailer was broken into. Request extra patrol.

Officers responded to a residence on cedar run where a subject was arrested for battery on his neighbor. The arrested suspect was the same individual that was arrested for robbing the CVS last month.

9/7

Officers responded to a prowler on Grant St. that was dressed in black clothing and broke into a van in a driveway. Nothing was taken and officers were unable to locate suspect.

9/8

Officers responded to a call of a subject that was making threats on taking his own life. Officers made phone call to subject who stated that he did not want to hurt himself and didn't want to cooperate with officers. Ping on phone revealed he was at IU West hospital which corroborated his story.

9/11

Officers responded to an attempted burglary call of a white male tall and skinny tried to gain entry into a residence on William Dr. He was wearing black clothing and left in a silver grand prix missing a black bumper.

9/13

Officers responded to Ashwood circle when the resident came home and found a bent credit card in home. Nothing appeared to have been taken, even though there was jewelry and firearms in the residence. Not known how entry was made. A search of the name of the credit card holder was a victim from a vehicle theft in June from IMPD North district.

9/15

Officers took an intimidation report where the female half had death threats made to her by ex-boyfriend. Ex is out of country and may return at the end of September. Female half is worried that the ex will attempt to abduct child from school. Extra patrol was requested for the residence and a warrant for suspect has been filed.

9/19

Officer took a theft report from Marathon station when a black male and black female attempted to pass a counterfeit \$100 bill. When attendant refused to process both became aggressive and threatening in nature and stole a handful of cigars on the way out the door. Subjects were arrested later after passing \$100 at Walgreens. IMPD also came out and identified the same individuals as committing these thefts in Indianapolis.

9/28

Officers responded to a residence on Vermont on the report of a domestic between a male and female. Reporter advised that the female was hitting the male. Upon officers arrival the spoke with the female half about the incident and she stated there was no battery. The male half had left the scene and officers were unable to obtain a statement from him.

Note:

I would like to take this opportunity to point out some instances that are not always in statistics. The Brownsburg Police road officer is very aggressive in the fight of Chief Dove's stance on drugs and especially heroin in our community. On numerous occasions and practically daily basis officers are constantly watching and seeking individuals that are frequenting hotels and businesses in Brownsburg to intercept and interview these individuals. This individual is not always arrested, nor is a report taken of the events. Many times members of the UDTF are contacted to either give advice or assist if needed. Chief Dove has stated how heroin is a community problem for Brownsburg that erodes at the community and can affect somebody we know. I would like to relay one instance of a "buyer" that was looking to make a purchase from a "dealer" and wanted to make the deal in Brownsburg. The "dealer's" reply was "I am not coming to Brownsburg because it is too hot". I believe this single statement speaks volumes about the hard work that Brownsburg Patrol Officers at solidifying the Chiefs stance against heroin and our community is better because of it.

USE OF FORCE

On 9/1 Officers initiated a felony traffic stop on a subject with firearms violation. Officers drew their firearms to safely have subject exit vehicle.

On 9/27 Officers initiated a felony traffic stop on 4 individuals for fraud. Officer firearms were drawn and pointed to conduct the stop and have subject exit the vehicle safely.

On 9/27 Officers assisted the Hendricks County Sheriff’s department on a physical domestic. Upon arrival a young woman was taken into custody who began to actively resist handcuffing and the officer removed his Taser from the holster and placed against the females back to gain compliance and proceed in handcuffing her.

On 9/28 Officers responded to the report of a domestic on Vermont St. Upon arrival Officers heard a woman screaming from upstairs. Officers went to the apartment and found a woman crying and then asked if there was anyone else there. She pointed to the back bedroom. Officers approached the bedroom and instructed the roommate to come out. One officer drew his Taser and pointed it at the subject while the other withdrew his firearm for the lethal force option. The subject complied and was taken into custody.
