ENFORCEMENT HIGHLIGHTS:

12/1/16

Cpl. Joe Fults responded to a residence on Enderly Ave in reference to statements a female was making. Based on her statements Cpl. Fults had enough information to take her to St. Vincent Stress Center for immediate detention.

Officers responded twice to 20 N. Jefferson, which is a mental health assisted living facility, on a report of a subject that was being violent according to the counselor. No other witnesses could corroborate this claim. The reporter had to leave due to a funeral and officers were unable to get a Judges immediate detention order by 4:00. Officers did not have enough evidence for them to make an ID.

12/11/16

Officer Daniel Brinson took a stolen vehicle report on Blue Ridge Ln. Victim's vehicle was stolen by his ex-girlfriend.

12/12/16

Cpl. West responded to Old National Bank on a call for suspicious person in a black explorer that was driving around the building and recording with a camera. The vehicle was occupied by a white male and female. After recording the subjects left the area. The bank is requesting extra patrol

12/18/16

Officer Brad Carr responded to a domestic on south Odell St. The male have was intoxicated and damaging items in the home. The female half gathered her belongings and left with the children. Female has moved into another residence and is no longer living at this residence. The parents of the male have were on scene and advised that the subject suffers from alcohol abuse and has been increasingly more hostile, violent and unpredictable towards all family members. The male subject has resisted officers in the past and his firearms had to be taken from his home. Officers are exercising caution and responding with multiple units.

12/19/16

Officer Brinson responded to Messiah Lutheran Church on a report of juveniles loitering and requests extra patrol.

Officer Brinson also responded to a residence on Bay Hill Cir. on a report of a homeowner finding footprints around his residence. They are requesting extra patrol for the neighborhood.

12/22/16

Cpl. West responded to a residence on S. Green St. on a report of a theft from a vehicle. Victim had multiple high priced items stolen from his vehicle including a handgun.

Cpl. Matt Wing responded to a call at the Village Pantry on S. Green St. Upon arrival they located the individual in a white Chevy dually. Officers on scene located several Dewalt tools that had the initials DCW etched in them. Suspect stated that his mom bought them for him at a flea market. Pictures of the tools were taken. There was not enough evidence at the time for any charges but officers remained on heightened awareness of this individual.

The very next day the subject was seen by the security guard loading a welder and salamander heater. Subject was GOA when officers arrived but located 6 storage units broken into. Officers located his truck at his residence however the property had been removed. Case has been assigned to Investigations.

12/23/16

Cpl. Sentany responded to a residence on N. Adams St where a subject tried hanging himself. A friend at the residence heard him choking and was able to get him down. Subject is depressed because he lost his son in a custody battle.

A subject checked into the Comfort Suites and made statements of PTSD to the hotel clerk which was relayed to Captain Benjamin Pyatt. Captain Pyatt discovered that the individual had cautions for violence and has been known to carry a gun. Officers were advised to use caution if dispatched to this location.

12/26/16

Officers were dispatched to a residence on Mindy Ln. to speak to a subject reference his grandson stealing from him. After the grandson's departure the subject spoke to police showing officers pry marks on his bedroom and closet door. It is believed that the grandson stole a gun from him. A larger list of other objects stolen will be forwarded to police.

Brownsburg ERT was activated to serve a warrant on an individual after he displayed a shotgun threatening to shoot his roommates after hitting them with a metal pole. Subject was taken into custody without incident.

USE OF FORCE

There were three Use of Force Reports on two different subjects for the month of December. Two were the pointing of firearm and another was a Taser “drive stun” on a combative suspect resisting arrest. Taser drive stun is the term used when an officer places the Taser against a suspect and activates the spark without deploying probes that penetrate the skin. It is a means of gaining control through pain compliance and not incapacity.

RESERVE

The Christmas Under the Stars parade although mentioned in the last months report did occur in December and was completely covered by the Reserve Division of the Brownsburg Police Department. Sgt. Kiritschenko was in charge of the detail and ran command at Lucas and N. Green St. She designated Officer Tanya Strawmyer as the coordinator who attended all necessary meetings to plan the event.

Reserve officers answered a request for help to assist the shifts in adverse weather conditions on December 16th and 17th. The Town along with much of the central state was under emergency weather conditions due to icy roads that were impossible to traverse and left many motorists stranded. The Brownsburg Police put out a page requesting manpower and several officers responded.

They also hosted an event titled “Cup of Cheer” where they handed out coffee, hot chocolate and \$500 in gift cards to shoppers at our local Wal-Mart. The coffee, hot chocolate and gift cards were all purchased by Friends Of the Reserve Division. (F.O.R.D)

FLEET:

The department used 4318 gallons of fuel for the month of December. We are still waiting on the delivery of three Explorers. A settlement for insurance money has been received to replace the Tahoe that was totaled out.
